Project Rachel

Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron will celebrate Mass for Life this Sunday at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral. This special Mass is for parents, grand-parents, aunts, uncles, siblings, friends, neighbors and all those affected by the loss of the unborn through abortion.

January 22 marks the anniversary of the United States Supreme Court's landmark decision in Roe vs. Wade. Since the 1973 decision, more than a million abortions have been performed in the United States each year. Many women who choose to abort a pregnancy suffer from the memory of what they have done, feeling separated from God, their families and even themselves.

Your gifts to the Catholic Services Appeal help the Archdiocese of Detroit minister through Project Rachel to those who have been touched by an abortion experience.
